

5. Digging holes is not allowed on the campsite. Please do not dig draining channels around the tents.
6. Playing equipment and pioneering materials are available by arrangement with the summerstaff/warden.
7. It is possible to arrange a campfire, but please consult the summerstaff/warden first who will show you the site and where to get your wood. The site must be made good after the campfire.
8. The hay barn is available for wet weather use.
9. The private accommodation in the farm and the grounds around the house is OFF LIMITS to campers. In cases of emergency the party leader may use the telephone and any call charges must be settled in cash promptly.
10. The opening hours of the Scout Centre shop are displayed at the entrance. The shop does not sell sweets, lemonade, ice-cream, etc.
11. Please respect the rule of silence between the hours of 23.00 and 07.00. If you need to enter or leave the campsite during these hours, please make the necessary arrangements with the summerstaff/warden beforehand.
12. Dormitory regulations:
 - a. no open fires
 - b. do not move the beds
 - c. no smoking
 - d. emergency lighting must be kept ON at all times.
13. There are mattresses but you will need to bring your own bedding.
14. All areas used by your group must be left clean and tidy and any loss, damage or breakage must be paid for.
15. If you have any queries or problems, please contact the summerstaff/warden.
16. On leaving, please remember Baden-Powell's words that you should leave nothing behind you but your thanks.



General information about Scout Centre Rotterdam

Small history of the Scout Centre Rotterdam

The Rotterdam Scout Centre was founded in 1966 and accommodated in an over 300 year's old farmhouse. It is voluntary managed by a family



The Centre has inside- and outside accommodations, especially for groups under guide. Also very suitable for study-courses and excursions.



The former stable of the farmhouse has been transformed into a coy shelter called "the Farm" and the meadows have been made into spacious green campsites. You can also camp in our 4-person or 12 person cabins. All guests have free access to toilets and hot showers.

During the summer our Centre is mostly visited by groups from different countries all over the world. Mostly there are more nationalities at the same period.



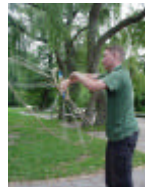
To help them during their stay, there is a Summerstaff present in the months July and August, who take care of the daily business. They are the persons to talk to for the guests at the Centre.

Activities on and in the surrounding of the Scout Centre.

The Scout Centre offers a variety of paid and unpaid activities.

Unpaid activities are:

- Building rafts: build your own raft from a manual, or build your own designed raft. All materials are at the Scout Centre.
- A variety of walking and bicycles.
- The use of the boats: in the water are three boats, which can be used for free. Peddles are available at the summerstaff.
- A variety of playing materials: there are all kinds of playing material to loan at the summerstaff. From balls to badminton rackets. And don't forget the yakar.
- A soccer field with goals.
- A volleyball field with net.
- The use of the rope bridges on the Scout Centre: there are two rope bridges on the Scout Centre, which can be used.



Paid activities are:

- Bow and arrow. For € 1,00 per person per hour. This is an activity which will take place under supervision. After a clear instruction you can try to shoot the bulls eye.
- Making friendships bracelets, for € 0,50 per person. You can do this with or without guide of the summerstaff.



Beside those activities the Scout Centre also offers the possibility to gain a unique badge: the Willow-badge.

This badge is only to gain at the Scout Centre and once you've gained it, your names will be put up the internet at the list of fame.

To gain this badge, you have to earn points from a variety of tasks on account of a task list. After you have earned your point the staff can buy the Willow-badge (€ 1,75).



The Scout Centre has also camping equipment for rent. After consultation with the warden, you can rent tents, but also a complete camping equipment.

The Scout Centre and rules:

1. You are very welcome at the Scout Centre. You have the use of the camping area, play area and the toilet and shower block. On arrival please report to the summerstaff/warden and we would appreciate it if foreign groups would provide us with a list of names, addresses and dates of birth of all members of party.
2. There are purpose-built fireplaces for outdoor cooking and the summerstaff/warden will show you where to obtain your firewood.
3. Campers using the kitchen are responsible for their own food hygiene.
4. Waste disposal bags for all your rubbish are available from the summerstaff/warden and when full should be deposited in the dustbins.
